Description

The property comprises three retail units which have been combined to provide a single accommodation at ground & first floor level. Both floors have a number of different sized rooms which could all be removed to create more open plan accommodation. Toilet facilities are available on both floors including a disabled w/c at ground floor. A small kitchen/staffroom is available on the first floor. The property has a three phased electric supply and a gas supply. Air conditioning is positioned on both floors within the rooms. The premises would ideally suit office use however a leisure or retail use could be possible with some alterations to the layout.

Location

The property is prominently located on Providence Street in the north east area of Wakefield city centre. This is a high profile and busy location being close to Trinity Walk shopping centre, The Ridings shopping centre and the city's established leisure circuit. Wakefield Bus Station is very close to the unit as are a number of car parking options.
